A 'Reconstructing Farm and Field' Led by David Cant

This investigation shows how the use of a variety of documentary resources including Township records, The Lloyd George Domesday of Lands 1909-1914 and the National Farm Survey can be used to reconstruct the development of a farm.

B 'Peopling the Past: Urban Landscapes in the mid C19' Led by Alan Petford

This is an investigation into one of the poorest areas of Manchester in the mid C19 using 5feet to one mile plans, eye witness accounts and census returns.

C 'Populating the Waste' Led by Mike Buckley

Using the Hearth Tax Survey of 1670 and the maps from 1625 onwards this study looks at the expansion of some settlements in Saddleworth following the enclosure of Quick Moor in 1625.

D 'The Impact on the Landscape of the Industrial Revolution' Led by Alan Schofield

Using the 1770 Manor Map of Saddleworth, the 1822 Township Map of Saddleworth and later OS maps this study examines the impact of Industrialisation on a small Pennine community.
